


The SAM

### **Parish Council News**

### **Exception Housing Scheme**

The main item on the Agenda at the Parish Council meeting in March was the Exception Housing Scheme proposal. North Norfolk District Council Strategic Housing Team and Broadland Housing Association are looking as developing a local needs mixed tenure exception housing scheme. Following a call for sites, proposals have been prepared to develop land on Kettlestone Road (just beyond Petersville) that would include the following tenures: affordable rent; shared ownership and market homes. Affordable rent and shared ownership homes are prioritised to households in housing need who have a local connection to Little Snoring and physically adjoining parishes, whilst market homes would initially be marketed to the local community. Exception housing scheme affordable rent and shared ownership homes are protected as affordable in perpetuity. Right to Buy does not apply. The site would have 19 dwellings with a maximum of 50% market housing. The western end of the field would be a green space to allow for the collection of rainfall. There would be a three metre access around the edge of the development. The access would be on to Kettlestone Road (and following comments would be moved further away from Pantile Cottages). Some of the existing roadside hedge would be removed to improve visibility at the junction and would be replaced with new hedging further inside the field.

Broadland Housing held a public exhibition drop-in event on Monday 27 March in the Community Room. They reported that over 50 people attended and 25 feedback forms were completed (a few more were taken away and will be posted). Of the responses received so far 3 were undecided, 13 supportive and 9 against. Comments included the impact of parking and traffic and school drop-off and pick-up particularly as the road is narrow and visibility poor; concern about how the access will impact on Pantile Cottages and their parking. Concern was also raised about sewage as the waste water treatment plant had already been identified as inadequate and the poor provision of GP and dental services in the area. Some queried the need for more social housing in the village and some suggested that the development would lead to more second home ownership.

The next steps for Broadland Housing are to commission a newt survey, consult with Highways and commission a hydrology modelling survey. If the feedback from the three consultations / surveys are clear the proposal will go to be submitted to the normal planning process with statutory consultation (including Anglian Water and the Parish Council). The public will also be able

to comment. This will also present an opportunity for the Parish Council to put in request for 'planning gain' for the community.

### **Playground Inspection**

The recent playground inspection report identified that some of wooden balance combo and log steps will need to be replaced as the wood is rotting. The Parish Council will be consulting with families and children to find out what new equipment they would like to have on the playing field. Do look out for a questionnaire asking for your views. It is hoped that we can work with the school to ensure to reach as many families and children as possible.

### **Coronation Celebrations**

### **Recipe Corner: Easter Biscuits**

These classic old-fashioned biscuits, originating from the West Country, are called Easter Biscuits because they were traditionally baked and given as a gift at Easter time.

### Ingredients:

- 75 g (3oz) butter
- 75 g (3oz) golden caster sugar
- 1 egg separated
- ¼ teaspoon ground cinnamon (can use nutmeg or mixed spice if preferred)
- 50 g (2oz) currants (could also use sultanas or raisins)
- 15 g (½oz) mixed peel (can be omitted or grated lemon and orange zest could be used)
- 175 g (6oz) plain flour
- 3 tablespoon milk
- golden granulated sugar to sprinkle

## You will need a 7cm (3in) round cutter Method:

- 1. Preheat the oven to 180°C (160°C fan)/350°F/gas mark 4.
- 2. Beat 75g (3oz) softened butter with 75g (3oz) caster sugar together until light and fluffy, then beat in 1 egg yolk.
- 3. Add ¼tsp cinnamon, 50g (2oz) currants and 15g (½oz) mixed peel and mix to combine, then beat in 3tbsp milk.
- 4. Add 175g (6oz) plain flour and mix to a stiff dough. Roll out the dough to 6mm (¼in) thick then use a 7cm (3in) round cookie cutter cut out biscuits and transfer to a baking sheet. Gather up the trimmings, roll and repeat.
- 5. Lightly beat the egg white and brush the surface of the biscuits with the egg white, then sprinkle with a little granulated sugar.
- 6. Bake for 15 18 minutes until pale golden.
