Parish Council News

The Parish Council was pleased to welcome a new member, Gary Brown, who was co-opted at the meeting in July. If you are also interested in being a part of local government, there is still one vacancy. Do contact the Clerk or councillors if you would like to be considered for co-option.

We are still awaiting feedback from Broadland Housing Developers concerning the results of the environmental survey and Highway's consultation regarding the site at the junction of Kettlestone Road and Thursford Road.

The Speed Awareness Messaging unit is currently out of action. It needs a new radar unit which costs just under £900. The Parish Council is enquiring if it

would be possible to apply for a 50% grant through the County Council's Parish Partnership Scheme.

Quotes are being sought to repair the roof on the bus shelter near the Village Sign. Some of the tiles are broken or missing and there is a hole in the board. If there is anyone in the village who would like to do this work, please do contact the Clerk.

It was reported that the lock on one of the litter bins near the play area was broken. It was agreed to get rid of this bin, particularly as it was sometime used for disposal of unbag dog poo. Please do not use the litter bins for dog poo. The litter bins are emptied by hand, and it is not hygienic or pleasant for people to have to handle dog faeces. There are two dog poo bins on the playing field – one near the car park and one near The Croft. Please use them and do not leave dog poo on the field or at the play area. We do not want children to get ill (and possibly go blind) from toxocariasis.

Playground Consultation. The questionnaire was delivered with the Newsletter in June and circulated to parents at Pre-School and Primary School. Thank you to those who responded. Of the 19 responses received all were in favour of new equipment. About 50% would maybe help with fundraising: donation, bake sale, coffee morning, yard sale, bingo, craft fair. Swings were the most popular choice, followed by the Trim Trail, Slide and then the Tipi carousel. There were additional requests for zip wire, pyramid climbing nets, ground level trampoline, items suitable for disabled children / wheel chair user, parallel bars, roundabout, fencing.

To purchase all the equipment, including a ground-level trampoline suitable for children in wheelchairs or pushchairs, another bench and picnic table would cost about £38,000. The Parish Council will apply to North Norfolk District Council's Sustainable Communities Fund which would probably cover the cost



of the ground level trampoline; that still leaves £27,000 for the rest of the equipment. While some of the shortfall can be raised through the Parish Council Precept (which is paid through your council tax), fundraising, donations and sponsorship will be needed.

Recipe Corner: Home-made Chocolate Ice cream Ingredients

200g dark chocolate chopped into small pieces 500ml double cream 340g sweetened condensed milk 1 tsp vanilla extract 3 tbsp cocoa powder, sifted 50g milk chocolate chips



Step 1: Melt the chocolate in a heatproof bowl set over a pan of just-simmering water, ensuring the bowl doesn't touch the water, or do this in the microwave in 20-second bursts until smooth and glossy. Leave to cool slightly.

Pour the cream, condensed milk and vanilla into a second bowl and beat for 3 mins using an electric whisk until slightly thickened and the beaters leave a trail in the mixture when lifted across the bowl. Be careful not to overwhip, as you don't want the mixture to be too stiff – as soon as the beaters leave a trail, it's ready.

Step 2: Gently fold the melted chocolate and cocoa powder into the cream mixture until thoroughly combined, ensuring the spatula is reaching the bottom of the bowl so all the chocolate gets mixed in. Fold in most of the chocolate chips, reserving a small handful. Scrape the mixture into a 1-litre freezer proof container, then scatter over the reserved chocolate chips. Cover and freeze for at least 6 hrs until firm but scoopable. *Will keep frozen for up to a month*. To serve, scoop the ice cream into chilled bowls or ice cream cones.


The Black Lion, Walsingham has re-opened under new management. The pub has had a refurb and is now open for breakfast, lunch and dinner.

Remember to pick up after you dog

Help keep the village clean and safe. The Parish Council has provided six red

dog bins and pays for these to be emptied. There are two bins on The Street, two on Thursford Road, and two on the playing field. Please use these bins or take the poo home and put in your own bin for general household rubbish.

It is an offence not to clean up after your dog in any public area (including roads, verges and private land open to the public) in North Norfolk. Failure to do so will incur an £80 fixed penalty fine (max £1,000).



Use the clues to help you solve the puzzle. Place ticks or crosses in the grid to identify the correct information in the grid.


